Compliance status

This website is **partially compliant** with the EN 301549 "Accessibility requirements for ICT products and services", the European Standard and [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.2 AA standard](#).

Non-compliance with the accessibility regulations

- C.9.1.1.1 – Non-text Content: Some images, icons, or other non-text content do not have a text description.

- C.9.2.5.3 – Label in Name: For some components, the name read by assistive tools does not match the visible label.
- C.9.3.3.1 – Error Identification: When an error is detected, the wrong field is not shown or the error is not described in text.
- C.9.3.3.2 – Labels or Instructions: There are no labels or instructions when the user must enter data.
- C.9.3.3.3 – Error Suggestion: When an error is found and a fix is known, the fix is not shown (unless it would break security or purpose).
- C.9.4.1.2 – Name, Role, Value: Some components do not pass their name, role, state, or value to assistive tools, or do not notify them of changes.
- C.9.4.1.3 – Status Messages: Some status messages cannot be read by assistive tools without changing focus.
